It was odd having Christmas fall on a Monday this past year. It made Advent so short, and then there was the layering of the non-religious hoopla layered onto the Fourth Sunday of Advent.



There's more to come in 2024.

Ash Wednesday falls on February 14th. That's right. "Remember you are but dust, and to dust you shall return. But won't you be my Valentine?" Everything you always wanted to know about *The Annual Meeting (but)*

Why do we have an Annual Meeting? Our parish for legal purposes is a corporation. We have Parish Bylaws

which correspond to the Canons of the Episcopal Church and the Diocese of Los Angeles. These state that our parish as well as every parish must have an Annual Meeting to elect "directors" which form the Vestry. The Vestry has responsibility for the "temporalities" of the parish. As in other congregations, it is the custom at Ascension that reports for the previous year are received, the budget for the next year, which the Vestry has already passed, is presented, and other business may be conducted. Occasionally, the Bylaws may be amended. Our Parish Bylaws state that the Rector presides, or in the absence of the Rector, the Senior Warden presides. At the Annual Meeting, we follow standard parliamentary procedure.

Who can attend? Everyone interested in our parish can attend the Annual Meeting. It is required that the time and place be announced beforehand. Our Parish Bylaws require us to have present twenty members who can vote to have a quorum.

Who can vote? The Diocesan Canons were changed a few years ago to include persons sixteen years and older as adult communicants in good standing. The canons were amended this year to essentially specify that in order to be an elector they must be:

- ⇒ An adult member of this parish who has received Holy Communion in this parish at least three times during the preceding year.
- ⇒ An adult communicant of this parish who for the previous year has been faithful in corporate worship, unless for good cause prevented, and has been faithful in working, praying, and giving for the spread of the Kingdom of God, in order to be considered a communicant in good standing.

A list of our qualified electors has been published by the Vestry, and *will be* posted on the bulletin board in Hawks Hall. Our Parish Bylaws and the canons do not permit either proxies or absentee ballots.

Who can be elected to the Vestry? Our Parish Bylaws and the Canons state that anyone qualified to vote at the Annual Meeting can be elected to the Vestry. Our Parish Bylaws also state that a member of our Vestry must be a confirmed communicant and cannot be a member of another church. It is expected (but not required) that anyone serving on the Vestry must be willing to commit the time necessary to serve, be regular in their attendance, be an example of good stewardship, and have a passion for the work of Christ in this parish. Some folks have already been nominated either by the nominating committee or by indicating their desire to run, and there will be time during the meeting for nominations from the floor as well.

Serving on the Vestry... Each year at our Annual Meeting, the parish elects a new class of vestry members – this year we will be electing three persons for regular three year terms. The "job description" includes being a committed member of the parish who is regular in attendance and giving and who is willing to offer his or her gifts for the leadership of this parish. Vestry members may have particular responsibilities or portfolios and will be serving on such sub-committees as Finance, Insurance, and Operations & Property. Meetings are held monthly, and attendance at the annual workday/retreat is critical.



Following the ONE Service at 9:30 am on Sunday, February 25, 2024 will be our Annual Meeting and (BIG Drum Roll, please!) a Church Potluck. The sign-up sheet is on the Bulletin Board in Hawks Hall. Not only do we need hot dishes, cold sides, desserts, and more; but we also will need people to sign-up for set-up and clean-up duties. (As I had noted in the January Spire, I am unable to handle all of these duties.) Therefore, any and all help will be much appreciated.

Sometimes our minds can make us feel so helpless. At times like these, hope becomes a challenge and God's love hard to imagine. And yet, there's God, always loving us unconditionally and enticing us to forge forward.

Most of us were taught that God would love us if and when we changed. In fact, God loves us so that we can change. Too often we overthink God's love and lose sight of the unconditionality of his love. Lent is the penitential season in which we are encouraged to make sacrifices to gain God's good favor, grace, and love...to change. But remember that God already loves us.

It's not true that we will never be holy enough, pure enough, refined enough to gain what we always and unequivocally have, God's love. This perfection message is misleading, and it puts change back on us which is the opposite of being saved. When we fall into God's mercy, when we fall into God's great generosity, which seemingly comes out of nowhere, we acquire the capacity to truly change - to become who we really are.

God loves us so that we can change. If we keep listening to that love, if we keep receiving that love, trusting that love – even with all our limitations, all our unworthiness — we start to experience in ourselves a sense of possibility. The great mystics and saints realized that it wasn't just *possibility* they experienced, but also *permission*. Permission as it were to color outside the lines, permission to be who they really were. It's not just gay people who have to come out of their closets.


We're all in our closets. The gay rights movement, and for that matter all *rights movements*, have given us a metaphor for what we all must do. Lent offers us the perfect opportunity to do just that – come out of our closets. We're all afraid to come out of our various closets. This liberation doesn't necessarily mean being outrageous or rebellious. It is so much better than that. It is permission to be the image and likeness of God that we already are. Each of us is unlike any other image or likeness. Each of us is unique, one of a kind, one in God.

Lent is the time to hear God say to each of us, "All I want for you to give to me is to be who you really are."

Mother Teresa loved to say, "The only real success is faithfulness." To be faithful to this inner love, God's love, is our greatest success. Then we know that in God's love, all things are possible.

Be well, be blessed, come out, come out, wherever you are.
