

There are plenty of situations in which we should say "NO." In some of those situations, we'll need to dig deep within to find the courage to say "NO." Not always an easy task.

# REAL FAITH

As we begin a New Year, I suggest we "Just Say No" in the context of "Just Say Yes!"

During Advent, we are reminded of the Blessed Mother's willingness to say "yes" to both shame and glory. Being a pregnant teenager without a husband is pretty shameful, and yet she said "yes." Mary also said "yes" to being the mother of God...not easy I'm sure, but certainly glorious and obviously not forgotten.

All too often our perceptions are based on expectations, and all too often those perceptions can be misleading and hold us back from making difficult decisions or simply from saying "yes" to doing the right thing when saying "no" can be so much easier. What Mary knew, what Mary demonstrated, was the importance of faith as the cornerstone of our decisions.

The New Year will bring many opportunities to say "yes" when what we really want to do is to say "no." When we look to Mary as a guide and have faith in doing what's good, what's proper, and what's pleasing to God, shame doesn't much matter; and it can open the way to experiencing the divine in new and deeply rewarding ways.

What Mary teaches us is that faith and trust will always lead us in the right direction. So, just say "yes" to shame and just say "yes" to glory...God will prompt you along. Not to worry.

Earlier this year in a homily, I introduced the acronym AATAT. **Admit...**that I need God's help. **Ask...**God for help. **Trust...**that God will indeed help. **Act...**do it – don't be afraid. **Thank...**thank God for whatever the outcome. Remember, we're simply acting on His behalf. We might not understand or even like the outcome, but that's okay.

Live well, live blessed, live like Mary! Happy New Year!!1



#### Your Tithe Dollars at Work


